

# Protect yourself

## Check fencing and gates routinely

Post signs indicating restricted and no access areas. Use no trespassing signs at all property and building access points and at intervals along fence lines.

## Security Cameras

Use security lighting, cameras, alarms and motion sensors.

## Be observant

Encourage your staff to do the same. Report suspicious activity, persons or vehicles; if possible, photograph and record descriptions and license plate information.



## Maintain basic security

Lock all doors and windows in barns, shops and offices, including office filing cabinets. Lock vehicles when not in use. Use computer passwords and have firewalls installed on any networked computer system. Keep all animal health products under lock and key.

## Always act professionally

Follow all protocols and regulations. Make sure your property is “camera ready,” including the timely disposal of deadstock. Do the right thing, but if things go wrong, correct and document.

## Remain calm

Don't be drawn into a conflict.

## Record and report

If you are the target of illegal activity, record and report to the appropriate authorities and to Ontario Pork.
